



### COVER LETTERS

- More info than your resume
- Demonstrates written communication skills
- Shows your interest in the job

If you don't have time to make a new cover letter for every job, don't worry about it! You still have a good chance without it

- Start your cover letter off with a hook
- Make a template to customize per job
- Changing company name and job position
- Changing whole paragraphs

Quadruple check that you put in the correct company name!

### TYPES OF COVER LETTERS

- Creative cover letters
- Bullet points mixed with sentences
- Very standard, paragraph style cover letter\*
- Google or ask someone if you are unsure on cover letter style for that industry







### LINKEDIN

- Add profile and cover photo
- Longer version of resume
- Write in sentences
- Show off interest and personality
- Fill out all sections
- Try to be active on LinkedIn

LinkedIn isn't crucial to have, but great to set up if you have time.



### GENERAL TIPS (I)

- Be open to a wide range of jobs
- Apply to jobs even if you don't meet all the criteria
- Don't feel like you need to have a job every summer\*
- All experiences are valuable
- Get involved in extra-curricular activities

### GENERAL TIPS (2)

- Start early and apply for LOADS of jobs
- People get rejected all the time
- Ask people to read over your application
- Avoid being too technical

Keep a list of deadlines in chronological order

- You don't need to have an 'engineering' job
- Consider volunteering
- Create your own summer job
- Do a summer project
- Take summer courses
